

LESSON THIRTY-THREE

For this lesson you are to go to the Index of Illustrative Scripture Passages, listed after the main Index, and read every scripture reference in your KJV and then read it in the textbook to see how it is used in context in the textbook passage.

NOTE: The references in the Index of Illustrative Scripture Passages that are not from the KJV (Esdras, Tobith, Ecclesiasticus, etc.) need not be included in this exercise.

Examples:

Genesis	
ii. 24	p. 310
xxii. 6	437
xxiv. 11	98

In the box to the left is a short portion of the first column of scripture references given in the Index of Illustrative Scripture Passages.

The procedure you will follow is:

1. Look up Genesis ii. 24 in your KJV.
2. Go to p. 310 in your textbook and see how that scripture is used in context in the textbook.
3. Look up Genesis xxii. 6 in your KJV.
4. Go to p. 437 in your textbook and see how that scripture is used in context in the textbook.
5. Look up Genesis xxiv. 11 in your KJV.

6. Go to p. 98 in your textbook and see how that scripture is used in context in the textbook.

7. Follow this same procedure for every scripture referenced in the Index of Illustrative Scripture Passages.

A. Read the reference in the KJV.

B. Go to the textbook page to see how the scripture is used in context in the textbook.

(The scripture may or may not be quoted in the textbook- it may only be referenced. Either way, check the usage for context.)

You must do this for every scripture referenced.
